### Changes to Wattsmart Business Program in Utah

In response to CEE updating their commercial unitary air conditioner specifications,<sup>1</sup> Rocky Mountain Power is planning changes to the Wattsmart Business program in Utah, effective June 15, 2024. As summarized in the table below, these changes include distributor incentive adjustments for unitary commercial rooftop units. **Any incentive amounts for current Program offerings not mentioned in the table below will remain unchanged.** Existing incentive terms and conditions still apply.
