Rocky Mountain Power Foundation grant helps purchase equipment for children needing physical therapy

LANDER, Wyo. — The Rocky Mountain Power Foundation has awarded a \$5,000 grant to Child Development Services of Fremont County, Inc. to help support its efforts to purchase physical therapy equipment for children between birth through 5 years of age. The equipment will help children who require therapy for delayed gross-motor development.

Child Development Services of Fremont County is a private, nonprofit organization that has served children since 1978. It provides early childhood education and intervention services for families with infants and preschool children with developmental disabilities at its main office in Lander and branch sites in Riverton, Shoshoni and Dubois.
