

Rocky Mountain Power, a division of PacifiCorp, is an energy company based in Salt Lake City, Utah. The business efficiently delivers reliable, affordable, safe and environmentally responsible energy to more than 1.2 million customers in Utah, Wyoming and Idaho. The company supplies customers with electricity from a diverse portfolio of generating plants including hydroelectric, natural gas, coal, wind, geothermal and solar resources.



WILDFIRE MITIGATION AND EXTREME WEATHER RESILIENCE

- Rocky Mountain Power has installed a network of 182 weather stations, growing to 282 by 2026, that provide continuous real-time information to a team of internal meteorologists. These experts employ a custom 30-year weather research and forecast model to provide weather and fire risk forecasts so we can detect and respond quickly to weather events.

- Rocky Mountain Power has installed advanced relay and recloser devices that support enhanced safety settings for rapid fault detection and isolation.
- To improve safety and service, Rocky Mountain Power has enhanced vegetation management in transmission and distribution rights-of-way, including annual inspections in high fire risk areas and hazard tree removal.



CUSTOMER INNOVATION

- Customers can access a variety of digital tools for energy usage information to help them better control their costs.
- Rocky Mountain Power's pioneering Wattsmart® Battery program employs a growing fleet of 3,500 customer batteries to enable greater use of renewable energy and to improve grid resilience. The program allows the company to harness batteries to maintain grid stability and reduce peak demand.



COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP

- Rocky Mountain Power is taking big steps to promote electric vehicle adoption in Utah to reduce vehicle emissions and improve air quality. Among the latest efforts is a \$50 million initiative to more than double the number of fast charging stations across the state. The company also hosted a public car show in Utah to showcase the latest in EV technologies.
- A total of \$16 million has been given to local communities since 2019 through a combination of corporate giving, employee contributions and grants by the Rocky Mountain Power Foundation.
- Through a new \$6.42 million U.S. Department of Energy grant, Rocky Mountain Power is collaborating with area universities, transit agencies and building owners to develop a "connected community" in Utah to study advanced energy solutions through grid-interactive buildings.
- Rocky Mountain Power crews installed 12 additional nest platforms at the Farmington Bay Bird Refuge in coordination with the Utah Department of Natural Resources. The new platforms provide more social nesting for Great Blue Herons, encouraging them to nest at the rookery rather than seeking out space on transmission line towers.
